- Game Schedule live Target Date 8/22
- Season Start Grades 3-8 Saturday 9/7
- Season Start HS Grade 912 Sunday 9/22
- Seatbelt Saturday/Sunday 9/28 9/29
- Referee Appreciation Weekend 10/5-10/6
- Referees paid after Week 3, Week 6, Week 9, and season close on 11/30

BAYS <u>RESPECT</u> Campaign

What do we want CLUBS to do:

- Share the BAYS RESPECT campaign directives with your coaches, parents, players and referees via email and reinforce it at your preseason Coach and Referee meetings.
 - Mass Youth Soccer Codes of Conduct
- Add your own voices within your clubs to amplify BAYS' efforts to make RESPECT the hallmark of our game.
- Consider suggesting that teams have Spectator Sideline Monitors to help ensure a positive and supportive cheering section for all.
- Armbands will be sent to new Active and Pending refs



Emphasize Game Management

- Review LOTG regarding fouls and misconduct:
 - Swearing, especially directed at someone specifically, is a straight red card
 - Using offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or action(s), especially directed at someone specifically, is a straight red card
 - Flagrant taunting, demeaning, or other derogatory language directed toward an opponent or the referee could be a yellow card or a red card depending on the severity of the incident.
- Encourage referees to immediately address unsportsmanlike behavior, like taunting, trash talking, name calling, etc. which often can escalate quickly if left uncalled.
- Early game management is key!
 - Even just holding up the game to speak to players signals to all that referees are watching, aware, and going to take action
 - Showing cards also helps maintain control
 - Yellow cards have minimal lasting consequences for the players, yet can significantly curb undesirable behavior on the field
- Referees should always remain professional and NOT engage/escalate issues with spectators, players, or coaches



Game Reports

- Timely NO pay without submitted game report
- Detailed comments from all referees for any: ZT, Red Card, Injury
 - ZT Ratings Guidelines
- Presence of comments flagged in Game Report Overview
- Referees sent reminder for unfiled game reports on scored games
- Downloadable Incomplete game report for assignors
 - My Bays->Referee Assignor->Referee Admin->Incomplete Game Reports
 - Will NOT list referees who have not ACCEPTED their games



Pre-Game Management

- Coaches sent reminders about required items so NO excuses:
 - All wearing valid credential no more than 3 team officials on sideline
 - Paper Roster
 - 15 minute rule
 - Jersey numbers written in (no duplicates)
 - If coach not listed on the roster, write in substitute coach's name
- Call out **numbers** not player names (sensitivity to mispronunciations)
- NO earrings, etc. See <u>Wearable item policy</u>
- <u>Line Assistants</u> If no ARs, draft line assistants: Must be credentialed if an adult or if a youth player registered with Mass Youth Soccer



Pre-Game BAYS Laws

- BAYS provides a 15-minute window for the referee(s) to show up for a scheduled game (LAW 5).
- If the official game starts late due to one of the above or weather, the Center Referee should adjust the shortened game time to two equal halves.
- Official games can start during the 15-minute window once:
 - A qualified referee arrives as per LAW 5/ single person crew options are met.
 - An adult credentialed person is present to coach each team
 - Both teams provide an official paper roster to the referee (MR1).
 - A friendly can be played if the paper roster is not provided.
 - The minimum number of players for each team are present (LAW 3)
 - 7 players to **start/continue** for 11v11
 - 6 players to **start/continue** for for 9v9
 - 5 players to **start/continue** for 7v7 including Grade 9-12

Assigning - Site Functionality

- Emails sent by clicking on blue envelope **automatically** CC in parent/guardian
- Other Official/4th referee slot available for all games
 - Town Paid Shows as \$0 rate since all towns will pay/use slot differently as mentors, trainees, field marshals, etc.
 - Assignment tracks through Referee Pay Download
 - Functions like another assistant referee
- Game Update Messaging
 - Free form text box for Assignors to use to send explanations/links/directions
 - to referees upon assignment changes
 - to referees AND coaches about rescheduling



Rearranged Games

- Move games to <u>Unscheduled</u> as **SOON** as you know game will not be played
 - Publicly viewable on team's schedule page
 - Notification sent to coaches
- <u>Replacement Game(RG) Process</u> starts with the CR game report that game did not complete or kick off
 - Division Director makes Replay/No Replay decision
- Late Cancellation process
 - By Thursday at 7pm for Sat/Sunday;
 - By noon the day before for Weekday games
 - Keep the email you get as back up
 - NEW 50/50 Fine assignment
- Teams No Show MR 16

Teams No Show	 Refs at the field Neither team or coach show up Fields are open and playable 	Center Referee by filing game report	 Yes – If at the field Original game shows with -1 suffix
Late Cancel	 One side or BOTH sides initiate a cancellation and fails to notify by stated window 	Referee Assignor	 Yes – game reports AUTO-generated Shows with -86 suffix
Forfeit	 One or both teams forfeit Can happen if team does not have roster or credentialed adult w/in 15 minutes 	Division Director	· Yes – if at the field
Rainout/unplayable field - When teams show up	· Game cannot be safely played or finished	Referee Assignor	 Yes – if at the field or on the way to the field
Rainout/unplayable field - When NO teams show up	 Refs on the field but no teams show up then EITHER Teams No Show or Late Cancel – NOT Both 	Referee Assignor	 Yes – if at the field or on the way to the field No – if club closes fields at least one hour before game time
